

Frequently Asked Questions

What should NOT be brought to camp?

For camper safety, and to encourage group interactions, the following items are not permitted at camp. If a camper brings these items, they will be confiscated and given to the parent at sign out:

- Electronic devices such as tablets, phones, video games and cameras.
- Expensive or sentimental jewelry.
- Personal toys
- Drugs, alcohol and weapons, or anything that resembles them.

Can my child bring their cellphone?

It is preferred that phones stay at home, however, we understand it may be the parents preference. If campers bring phones, they may only be used for parental communication. If this privilege is abused, the campers phone may be held until the end of the day. Please be aware that the Kroc Center is not responsible or liable for lost, stolen or damaged cell phones.

What should my child wear to camp?

- Closed-toe shoes with socks.
- Clothes suitable for active play. We do not advise skirts or dresses.
- Swimsuit and towel in a separate waterproof bag.

What if my child gets sick or injured?

If a camper is too ill or hurt to comfortably continue their camp day, parents/guardians will be contacted immediately. Day Camp staff will treat minor scrapes and bruises and complete an Incident Report form. If medical attention is needed or if an injury is severe, parents/guardians will be notified and emergency services (911) will be called.

What if my child has special needs?

The Kroc Center is committed to the inclusion of all children in our Day Camp program, however we want to ensure proper care can be provided. For children with special needs, we ask that their parent/guardian call 402.905.3517 to set up an interview with the Camp Director to determine if we can provide reasonable accommodations to meet the child's needs.

Can my child play at the Kroc Center until I pick them up?

If a camper meets ALL of the following requirements, they may utilize the Kroc center after Day Camp ends :

- The camper is an active Kroc member.
- Campers 12+ can stay past camp hours without registering for Extended Care PM.
- Campers under the age of 12 must be picked up by 5pm or be registered for Extended Care PM

Daily Camp Details

Extended Care is available for an additional fee if you need an earlier drop-off or later pick-up time.

AM Extended Care: 7:30-8:30am
\$25 for the week

PM Extended Care: 5:00-6:00pm
\$25 for the week

If Extended Care has not been pre-purchased and there is an early drop-off or late pick-up, a \$10 fee will be charged for each occurrence.

Breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack are provided for every camper.* Please include all pertinent allergy information on the registration form.

Breakfast is served daily at 8:30am, lunch is flexed around our camp schedule between 11:00am-Noon.

**The Kroc kitchen is not an allergy free facility. If your child has food allergies, you are welcome to send them with an allergy free breakfast lunch, and snack every day.*

Info For Parents Of Campers

Medical Needs

Please include all pertinent medical information and/or allergies on the registration form. If your child needs medication administered during Day Camp, please be aware that The Salvation Army Kroc center is not authorized to disperse medication, and you will need to make other arrangements for your child to receive his/her medications. Kroc Center staff cannot store, hold or dispense any non-prescription or prescription medications.

Camper Assistance

As deemed by The Salvation Army, and as part of our Safe From Harm protocol, we are unable to assist campers with changing clothes for pool and swim activities. Campers must be able to change from their clothes into their swimsuit and then back into their clothes. If this is not possible, and a parent/guardian is unavailable to assist, the child will have to observe from the pool deck during the swim portion of the Day Camp program.
